Program Purpose: The Practical Nursing program is designed to prepare students to write the NCLEX-PN for licensure as practical nurses. The program prepares graduates to give competent nursing care. This is accomplished through a selected number of occupational courses providing a variety of techniques and materials necessary to assist the student in acquiring the needed knowledge and skills to give competent care. The nursing program covers all theoretical content areas outlined in Georgia Board Rule 410-9-06 (5a & 5b). A variety of clinical experiences is planned so that theory and practice are integrated under the guidance of the clinical instructor. Program graduates receive a practical nursing certificate and have the qualifications of an entry-level practical nurse. The PN21 program is a certificate program to be implemented with new cohorts of students beginning Fall 2024 and beyond. Students will have to submit a satisfactory criminal background check as well as a drug screen to be placed in a clinical health care facility to complete the clinical rotations of their educational training.

Program Length and Completion: Students must be fully admitted to the college for the program start semester prior to submitting the PN program application to be considered for admission to the Practical Nursing Technical College Certificate of Credit (TCC) and may complete the program in three semesters. The PN program is designed for on-time program completion in three (3 Semesters) from start of PNSG 2030-Fundamentals). Students must complete the PN program within 18 months (4 semesters) of enrollment in PNSG 1605 - Fundamentals. (Georgia Board of Nursing Rule 410-9-.06(1) (3a).

Admission Requirements: Students who intend to apply to the Practical Nursing Technical College Certificate of Credit (TCC) program must initially enroll in one of the following college's majors: Health Care Assistant Certificate, Healthcare Science Certificate or Interdisciplinary Studies- Health Track. Admission into the Practical Nursing Program is competitive and the program does not maintain a waiting list. Please consult the Practical Nursing webpage on the college's website for specific program admission information.

- Practical Nursing (TCC)
 - Age: Students must meet all admission requirements of the college and be at least 17 years of age
 at time of admission and have reached the age of 18 (to be eligible to apply for the NCLEX-PN
 examination for licensure- (O.C.G.A. TITLE 43 Chapter 26 Article 2 43-26-36) by program on-time
 completion (program completion within
 3 semesters of program admission).



Educational Requirements:

- High School Diploma, GED or its equivalent is required for program entry.
- College Admission: Students seeking admission to the nursing program must be fully admitted to the college for the program start semester. Example: Program starts Summer 2025 then student must be fully admitted to the college for Summer Semester 2025).
 This includes a Chatt Tech student ID and verified transcripts.

Students seeking admission to the Practical Nursing Program <u>must be fully admitted</u> to the college for the program start semester. Program applicants must be fully <u>admitted to the college at the time of program application.</u> All students must be in academic good standing at Chattahoochee Technical College to be considered for program admission.

- Enrollment Major: Students who intend to apply for the Practical Nursing TCC program must initially enroll in one of the following college's majors: Health Care Assistant Certificate, Healthcare Science Certificate or Interdisciplinary Studies- Nursing Track.
 - Note: Students who intend to apply to the LPN to ASN Bridge program after PN program completion are encouraged to enroll in the Health Sciences Certificate program or Interdisciplinary Studies- Health/Nursing track to complete the associate degree level prerequisite courses which are required for the Associate of Science in Nursing: LPN to RN Bridge program. Note: Future admission consideration for the LPN to RN Bridge program includes: successful PN program completion, successfully completing the NCLEX-PN Licensure Exam, AND showing proof of an active, unencumbered State of Georgia PN License.
 - Note: No core courses are required for application or acceptance to the PN program. Please refer to the Competitive Admission Selection Process on the PN program webpage to determine how additional points may be awarded for completion of certificate, diploma or degrees or selected license/National Registry verification.

Additional Requirements:

AGE: Must be 18 years old or older at the time of projected program completion. Submit a valid driver's license or birth certificate.

<u>CPR Requirements:</u> The student must hold a current American Heart BLS Healthcare Provider CPR upon entry into and throughout the program.

<u>Program Exams</u>: Standardized achievement tests as well as comprehensive final exams are given in each PNSG course throughout the program. All students are required to participate in the standardized evaluation process. Failure to participate will result in failure of the course.

In-Person Program Orientation AND Health/Immunization Requirements: Once accepted into the PN program, the accepted student will receive the date/time of the required In-Person Orientation as well as a list of items needed at the time of the scheduled PN program Orientation. This list may include but is not limited to a Physical Exam, Drug Toxicology, and Criminal Background Check (all required) as well as an immunization record (including but not limited to a current seasonal Flu immunization, and other current vaccines) that are required by clinical facilities in order to participate in the required clinical courses.



Background Checks: Background Checks: Those who have been arrested/convicted of a moral and/or legal violation of the law may not be allowed to complete the clinical/practicum requirements (determined by the clinical facility assigned to) or granted permission to take the NCLEX-PN licensing examination (determined at the time of application for the NLEX-PN after successful program completion. The program does not require vaccination for program admission; however, each clinical/practicum site reserves the right to deny a student entry based on their own policies and procedures. Clinical/practicum sites mandate vaccinations against specific diseases such as COVID-19, influenza and/or testing for specific diseases such as tuberculosis. Students are required to follow the medical clearance policies designated by their assigned clinical and/or practicum sites. If a student is denied entry to a required clinical/practicum site based on lack of vaccinations or testing, the student will not be able to complete the clinical/practicum course. As a result, successful completion of the program may not be possible.

<u>Program Policies & Procedures:</u> Program Policies and Procedures: Students will be provided a copy of the PN Student Handbook during their first semester of occupational (PNSG) courses. The PN Student Handbook is used in conjunction with the Chattahoochee Technical College (Chatt Tech) College Catalog and Student Handbook and serves as a means of informing the student of specific program policies and procedures related to the PN program. The policies and procedures of the PN program may change during a student's period of enrollment in the program. Students are expected to be proactive in obtaining information regarding these changes.

COMPETITIVE SELECTION, POINT SYSTEM

For admission into the PNSG occupational courses, requirements as outlined by the College must be met. Admission to the program is academically competitive. Prospective students will be ranked by several factors and the top candidates will be accepted for program admission. Students will be notified by Chatt Tech email regarding their acceptance status once all file evaluations are complete.

Applicants will be ranked on a point scale for competitive selection based on the individual's <u>Mandatory TEAS test</u> score and <u>Additional Optional Items</u> listed below. Applicants with the highest overall point scores will be accepted for admission based on the number of available program openings for that specific semester.

REQUIRED COMPETITIVE ENTRANCE EXAM: ATI TEAS 7th Edition:

- Required for admissions consideration.
- The ATI TEAS is a standardized test that measures the student's ability in math, reading, grammar and science. A study guide and practice test can be purchased through the ATI Website. The ATI TEAS is available through Chattahoochee Technical College's Testing Center.
- Must be taken by required deadline posted on the PN Advising Booklet Cover page. No more than two attempts within one calendar year. Must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days in between the two attempts. Attempt results must be available and received by the program's established pre-admission deadline.
- The ATI TEAS score is valid for five years and the highest valid score will be used for points.
- Note: If multiple scores are received within a 5-year period, the highest attempt will be used in the selection process.
- For the selection process, the student will receive the number of points representative of the TEAS Composite Score. Example: Composite Score = 80%. Student would receive 80 points.
- ATI TEAS Score: Minimum 60 Composite Score Required
 - O Note: ATI Scores below 60% will have a value of "0" points.

Additional Optional Items

Students may be awarded additional points on their ranking score based on the following items:

 Completed college certificate, college diploma, or degree (in the event of multiple awards, points from the highest earned award will be applied to the ranking score). Official transcripts showing the conferment of the award must be received by CTC by the application deadline.
