PROGRAM: Associate of Science in Nursing (NU73) FALL Semester Entry

Program Purpose: The Chattahoochee Technical College Associate of Science Nursing Program prepares men and women to become safe practitioners in the delivery of health care. The curriculum provides a strong foundation in the practice of nursing and prepares the student to function safely within the framework of the registered nurse role. The faculty in the Chattahoochee Technical College Associate of Science Nursing Program believes that our role as nurse educators is to incorporate multiple teaching strategies to enhance student learning and to provide a caring, nurturing, supportive environment. The ASN Program offers two options leading to the associate of science in nursing degree: The Traditional Option and the L.P.N.-A.S.N. Bridge Option.

Throughout the program, students integrate classroom theory with clinical experiences that are related to the theory component. Nursing education incorporates effective therapeutic communication techniques, critical thinking and clinical reasoning skills, and the development of sound nursing judgment. Clinical experiences are selected to provide the associate degree nursing student with the greatest opportunity to become clinically competent. The ultimate goal of the faculty is to prepare the student to become a safe practitioner of nursing who will be an asset to the nursing profession and continue his/her professional growth and development.

Graduates of the program are eligible to take the *National Council Licensing Examination for Registered*Nurses (NCLEX-RN). Upon successfully passing the NCLEX-RN and meeting the requirements of the Georgia Board of Nursing, graduates are granted licensure to practice nursing in the state of Georgia as registered nurses.

Program Length: A full-time student who has successfully completed all pre-requisite courses with a C or better and who has been admitted into the Associate of Science in Nursing degree program can complete the Associate of Science in Nursing degree program in four semesters. Student must complete the program within six (6) semesters of enrollment in RNSG 1115- Foundations of Nursing Practice.

Admission Requirements: Students must meet all admission requirements of the college and have reached the age of 18. Students who intend to apply to the ASN program must enroll in Health Sciences Certificate program or Interdisciplinary Studies- Nursing track to complete the associate degree level prerequisite courses. The completion of the prerequisite courses does not guarantee admission into the ASN program. Admission into the ASN program is competitive and the program does not maintain a waiting list.

- Associate of Science in Nursing
 - Age: at least 18 years of age prior to the first day of the term for which student will enroll in the program. Submit a valid driver's license or birth certificate.
 - Educational Requirements:
 - A high school diploma, GED, or approved high school equivalency assessment (verified by an official transcript, including graduation date) will be required for program entry.
 - High school diplomas must have been awarded by a state-recognized secondary institution.
 - College Admission: Students seeking admission to the program must be fully admitted to Chattahoochee Technical College for the semester that the student intends to submit the program application. Please refer to the college's published document deadline (this includes any official college transcripts from previous colleges) on the college website.



Additional Requirements:

<u>CPR Requirements:</u> The student must hold a current <u>American Heart BLS Healthcare Provider CPR</u> upon entry into and throughout the program.

<u>Program Exams</u>: Standardized achievement tests as well as comprehensive final exams are given in each RNSG course throughout the program. All students are required to participate in the standardized evaluation process. Failure to participate will result in failure of the course.

<u>In-Person Program Orientation AND Health/Immunization Requirements:</u> Once accepted into the Associate of Science program, the accepted student will receive the date/time of the required In-Person Orientation as well as a list of items needed at the time of the scheduled Associate of Science program Orientation. This list may include but is not limited to a Physical Exam, Drug Toxicology, and Criminal Background Check (all required) as well as an immunization record (including but not limited to a current seasonal Flu immunization, and other current vaccines) that are required by clinical facilities in order to participate in the required clinical courses.

Background Checks: Those who have been arrested/convicted of a moral and/or legal violation of the law may not be allowed to complete the clinical/practicum requirements (determined by the clinical facility assigned to) or granted permission to take the NCLEX-RN licensing examination (determined at the time of application for the NLEX-RN after successful program completion. The program does not require vaccination for program admission; however, each clinical/practicum site reserves the right to deny a student entry based on their own policies and procedures. Clinical/practicum sites mandate vaccinations against specific diseases such as COVID-19, influenza and/or testing for specific diseases such as tuberculosis. Students are required to follow the medical clearance policies designated by their assigned clinical and/or practicum sites. If a student is denied entry to a required clinical/practicum site based on lack of vaccinations or testing, the student will not be able to complete the clinical/practicum course. As a result, successful completion of the program may not be possible.

<u>Program Policies & Procedures:</u> Program Policies and Procedures: Students will be provided a copy of the ASN Student Handbook during their first semester of occupational (RNSG) courses. The ASN Student Handbook is used in conjunction with the Chattahoochee Technical College (Chatt Tech) College Catalog and Student Handbook and serves as a means of informing the student of specific program policies and procedures related to the ASN program. The policies and procedures of the ASN program may change during a student's period of enrollment in the program. Students are expected to be proactive in obtaining information regarding these changes.

COMPETIVE ADMISSION PROCESS

Required for Admission to the Associate of Science (Traditional Track) Program:

- 1. GPA of 2.0 or higher
- 2. Chatt Tech College Admission: Applicants seeking admission to the nursing program must be fully admitted to the college for the program start semester. Example: Program starts Fall 2025 then student must be fully admitted to the college for Fall 2025. This includes a Chatt Tech Student ID and verified transcripts. Please see Chattahoochee Technical College Catalog regarding Transfer Credit.
- 3. Students seeking admission to the ASN program must be fully admitted to the college for the program start semester. Program applicants must be fully admitted to the college at the time of the program application.
- 4. Completion of <u>ALL</u> Required Core Courses <u>by end of semester prior to program start</u>.

COMPETITIVE SELECTION, POINT SYSTEM

Applicants will be ranked on a point scale for competitive selection based on the individual's <u>Mandatory TEAS test score</u> and <u>Additional Optional Items</u> listed below. Applicants with the highest overall point scores will be accepted for admission based on the number of available program openings for that specific semester.

Mandatory: TEAS Examination - Version 7

Minimum Composite Score of 70 on the TEAS Examination

- Applicants who fail to obtain the required TEAS composite core will not be considered for admission into the

If student fails to attain a minimum grade of "C" in all Nursing required program courses, the student will be withdrawn from the program and not allowed to continue.

Students who fail more than two RNSG courses within the major, will be withdrawn from the program and will not be considered as a re-admission when the course is next available. The student with two course failures within the major may RE-APPLY as a new student adhering to all of the new student program application requirement. The student's application will be reviewed using the required ASN admission and competitive admission requirements at that time. Admission is not guaranteed.

I acknowledge that:

- 1. I have received counseling and advisement as to the preferred course sequencing and acknowledge that it is my responsibility to ensure adherence to the schedule.
- 2. I am aware that upon entering RNSG 1115, I have six (6) semesters to complete the program.
- 3. I understand that a grade of "C" or above is required for successful completion of any course. However, a semester GPA of 2.0 must be maintained to remain in the program.
- 4. I understand that if I vary from the prescribed course sequence listed above, I may be unable to graduate within the regular program length and may not be able to schedule courses as needed.
- 5. I understand that acceptance in the Associate of Science in Nursing Traditional Track program is not guaranteed and that each year only the top candidates are selected for enrollment. I am also aware that the program does not utilize a "waiting list".

This program prepares its graduates for licensure under the guidelines of the Georgia Board of Nurses. Therefore, the criteria utilized for the competitive admission of students were selected as a means to increase the chances for success not only in the ASN program, but for licensure and future employment.
