
Scholarships: Contribute to the Chattahoochee Tech Scholarship Fund, which awards scholarships to students enrolled in programs for high-demand careers, as determined by the college President. Donors who give \$1,000 or more are invited to meet scholarship recipients at our annual scholarship reception.

Endowed scholarships, designed to be permanent and perpetual, are established with a minimum \$25,000 donation. We administer the scholarship recipient selection process based on eligibility requirements that you determine.
